NOTE: At least eighteen (18) credit hours of the undergraduate electives must be University General Education (UGE) elective credits, of which at least six (6) must be in courses numbered 300 or above. Of these eighteen (18) UGE credits, three (3) may be taken within the College of Architecture, Planning, and Design. None, however, can be in a student's major field. No more than two (2) UGE courses may be taken in a single discipline. UGE courses must be taken at KSU. Transfer credits may reduce the number of lower level UGE courses required—see sliding scale available at <http://www.ksu.edu/catl/uge/welc3.htm#trans>. Students who participate in study abroad programs approved by KSU will meet UGE credit at the 300 level upon successful completion of the program.
